I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description

Designed to integrate literacy instruction with online instruction in an authentic application by exploring various curriculum design models and contemporary technologies specific to literacy pedagogy. This course applies to licensure and non-licensure students who have an interest in applied literacy instruction in a classroom or professional environment.
