#### I. Course Information

# A. Catalog Description

Explores frequently discussed, but difficult to define, concepts of leadership. Discussion will provide undergraduate leaders the opportunity to explore the concepts of leadership and to develop and improve their leadership skills.

#### B. Additional Information

Students investigate leadership characteristics and practices through four learning strategies: 1) reading current texts on leadership and biographies of leaders; 2) discussions in which personal values, ethics, and political positions are examined and argued; 3) participation in experiential exercises both as leaders and as followers; and 4) writing both personal and documented papers for individual discovery of their own leadership style and values.

## **II.** Student Learning Outcomes

### A. Subject Matter

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Discuss various topics in the texts and write papers to explain and support individual points of view.
- 2. Conceive, complete and report to the class on a small group project that benefits the university or local community.
- 3. Write a paper defending a political party perspective.
- 4. Write a paper on the biography of a 20<sup>th</sup> or 21<sup>st</sup> century leader summarizing his/her leadership qualities and why those qualities are admirable.
- 5. Demonstrate leadership skills by participating as a member in at least one club or organization other than the Chancellor's Leadership Council.
- 6. Represent the CLC, the Chancellor, and the University in a professional manner at various events.

- 7. Attend events for specific learning opportunities at the discretion and direction of the Chancellor.
- 8. Evaluate his/her work and progress as a leader.

## **B.** University Learning Outcomes

This course enhances student abilities in the following areas:

## **Analytical Skills**

**Critical Thinking Skills:** Students will draw conclusions. Students will defend their perspectives, views, and opinions via the Socratic Method.

## **Communication Skills (Oral and Written)**

Students will communicate proficiently through listening, discussion, writing, and presentations; take leadership roles on identified projects; and represent the Chancellor and the University of Arkansas - Fort Smith at various functions.

### **Ethical Decision Making**

Students will examine and discuss the political, social, economic, ethical, philosophical, and practical realities of different kinds of leadership roles.

## **Global and Cultural Perspectives**

Students will reflect upon cultural differences and their implications for interacting with people from cultures other than their own. Students will practice civility and respect for others and their views.
