I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description

Develops global competency, citizenship, and leadership through the study of current issues and future forecasts. Focuses on personal responsibility in a global context of business. Special emphasis is placed on the local impact of global issues and events.

1. Analyze the role of turbulence in modern society
2. Identify and evaluate the issues of global population
3. Describe and discuss how nature resources define our global society
4. Categorize and formulate how new technology will solve problems and evaluation global outcomes on technology
5. Differentiate sources of information and evaluate how social media limits or expands decisions
6. Assess and predict the history and future of economic integration
7. Critique the history of conflict/security and reframe conflict/security for the future
8. Identify the failed nation states, review governance, and prioritize the role of government, NGOs, inter-governmental agencies, and intra-governmental agencies
