### I. Course Information

## A. Catalog Description

An eight week course that includes theory/clinical experience in nursing care needed by patients in acute or sub-acute, or convalescent stages of illness. Emphasis is placed on acute and chronic medical conditions and common surgical conditions including basic principles of first aid.

#### **B.** Additional Information

This is a continuation of medical and surgical nursing theory and clinical experience with patients in acute, sub-acute, and rehabilitative stages of illness. Emphasis is placed on advanced medical conditions and common surgical conditions.

Students will be in clinical rotations two days per week. The clinical rotations will focus on the care of one to three assigned patients on average per day, providing care, treatments as appropriate, and administering medications (minimal IV management).

All students will be rotated to each clinical site, with experiences to be gained from assigned clinical floors.

The theory aspect of the course will be provided two days per week on campus. Topic will include medical and surgical nursing theory with organizations by body systems.

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Assessment and Intervention Skills: Use assessment and intervention skills with all assigned clients.

- 6. Management Skills: Use management skills to organize the care of multiple clients.
