#### I. Course Information

## A. Catalog Description

Study of instruments of the percussion family to the extent that scales and/or rudiments and grade one and two solos can be played on selected instruments. Designed as a practical preparation for public school instrumental teachers.

- 1. Develop a basic level of performance ability on snare drum, keyboard percussion, timpani, accessory percussion, marching percussion, drum set and world percussion instruments.

- 3. Examine percussion maintenance and mechanics.
- 4. Develop a sense for sound quality of percussion instruments, especially in relation to technique.

- 7. Examine a variety of percussion literature.
