I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description

Focuses on preparation and performance of scenes from musical theatre, operas, and operettas. Emphasis is on musical preparation, movement, and diction. May be repeated for a total of four hours.

1. Perform of solo and small ensemble vocal works.
2. Interpret and stage musical theatre and operatic literature both in theory and Practice.
2. Understand basic terminology as regards movement on Stage.

4. Collaborate on set design and preparation.
