I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description

Focuses on the development of skills necessary for assessing the physical health status of both adult and pediatric clients. Skills of inspection, auscultation, palpation, and percussion are emphasized. Students apply classroom content in clinical and simulated laboratory situations. Course meets the UAFS BSN program's requirement for health assessment.

B. Additional Information

This in-depth course focuses on client interviewing techniques, obtaining complete client health histories, and assessment of clients across the life span. It is designed to assist students in learning to communicate with clients, to obtain narrative assessments, and to perform physical examinations.
