I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description

Focuses on the care of women and children along the health and illness continuum. Students may apply the nursing process to address care of the well child; child with acute, chronic and/ or life threatening conditions; normal pregnancy; high risk pregnancy; care of the healthy and high-risk newborn and women's health issues.

B. Additional Information

The course will be presented utilizing multiple teaching/learning strategies.

II. Student Learning Outcomes

A. Subject Matter

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will:

- 1. Formulate **critical thinking** in addressing the care of the well child; child with acute, chronic, and /or life threatening conditions; normal pregnancy; high-risk pregnancy; care of the healthy newborn and women's health issues.
- 2. Integrate the use of nursing **research** in the care of the well child; child with acute, chronic, and/or life threatening conditions; normal pregnancy; high-risk pregnancy; care of healthy newborn and women's health issues.
- 3. Engage in various forms of age-appropriate **communication** to address care of the child, woman and pregnant client throughout the lifespan.

- 4. Promote **leadership and management** responsibilities while applying the nursing process to address care of women and children throughout the lifespan.
- 5. Advocate **health promotion** activities in the nursing care of women and children.
- 6. Promote the **role of professional nurse** in interacting and caring for women and children.
