I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description:

Provides students competencies and strategies to transition from student to baccalaureate prepared nurse. Focus on steps/materials to pass RN-NCLEX©. Study purpose and structure of RN-NCLEX©, test blueprint, computerized adaptive testing, multiple choice, and alternate item format questions. Use the ATI Comprehensive predictor to assess strengths and weaknesses and develop a comprehensive, personal plan of study for RN-NCLEX©.

B. Additional Course Description:

Content focus is on review of the current nursing content, test approaches, and other topic areas designed to achieve success on the NCLEX, and preparation the learner for entry level professional nursing practice. At the end of this course, with appropriate study and practice in the classroom, the student will be prepared to take NCLEX-RN.
