A. Catalog Description

A brief study of the Old Testament. Selected books and passages are given special attention to gain a deeper understanding of the Old Testament

B. Additional Information

This course is an introduction to the Old Testament and the history of ancient Israel considered within the larger context of the ancient Near East and with specific reference to the Hebrew's own interpretation of history as found in the Old Testament. Whatever one's particular beliefs area, it cannot be denied that the Old Testament remains one of the most significant formative historical documents of Western Civilization. The Old Testament will be compared with Ancient Near Eastern archeology and other historical documents such as the ENUMA ELISH, the Dead Sea Scrolls, the Nag Hammadi texts, and the Egypt Wisdom Books.
