Tips for a Successful Advising Session:

- 1. Schedule your appointment on Navigate
- 2. Bring your Lions ID card
- 3. Bring an updated degree plan
- 4. Bring a list of proposed courses
- 5. Take notes during your appointment
- 6. Ask questions during your appointment (time management, social needs, academic needs, etc.)
- 7. Keep in touch with your advisor we like to build relationships with students!

Why does Amber love advising? The students! Amber loves getting to work with each student in the college and empower them to take charge of their educational and career goals.


Her favorite part about working at UAFS is working alongside the staff in the CAS Advising Center.

FACULTY ADVISOR SPOTLIGHT

1. What is your philosophy on faculty advising as a vehicle for student success?

A good faculty advisor makes all the difference in the world! Students often see universities as analogous to medieval guilds, that is to say, as impenetrable mysteries. Our job as advisors is to demystify the advising process for students and help them succeed. We do this by getting to know them, by helping them decide what courses best serve their interests and the future career goals, by alerting them to problems and concerns, and by being their advocates when they encounter issues they cannot resolve by themselves. Advising, when done properly, is rewarding work because it facilitates student success.

2. Describe your passion for advising students!

I enjoy advising students for several reasons. First, I received excellent advising when I was an undergraduate and I hope to do the same for my advisees at UAFS. Second, helping students navigate difficult situations and solve problems definitely leaves me feeling satisfied and like I made a difference in their lives. Third, I enjoy advocating for students when they encounter problems they cannot solve by themselves. Fourth and final, I hope that my advising, along with the other knowledge and skills they have gained at UAFS, leaves students well-equipped to succeed in whatever career path they choose.
