2. These courses are used to determine major GPA, see Graduation Requirements. A cumulative GPA of 2.00 is required in these courses to meet graduation requirements for the College of Business and Industry.			
3. Electives, 12 hours: MATH 1303 or MATH 1403 is eligible to be used as a general elective if needed as a prerequisite for STAT 2503. CCCUA MATH 1123 College Algebra, SPD 1021 Transfer Seminar and SPD 1002 Success Strategies will count for 6 hours, UAFS FIN 1521 will count for one hour.			

4. Required Business Computing Competency may be fulfilled by successful completion of BUS 1003 Microcomputer Applications from CCCUA.
5. Lower-level Business Core, 24 hours (includes ECON 2813). Review College of Business and Industry admission requirements for standards of performance.
6. Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.
