Cossatot Community College of the University of Arkansas (CCCUA) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership (BSOL) degree from the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the bachelor degree requirements at CCCUA by completing an Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or an Associate of General Studies degree in programs approved by CCCUA. Completed CCCUA courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the BSOL degree requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. UAFS will offer the remaining BSOL degree requirements through online courses. Per the partnership agreement, UAFS will transfer up to 75 hours of lower division coursework for the BSOL.

- 3: Lower-level Electives 37 hours. 10000 and 20000 level elective courses earned as part of the associate degree (excluding Intermediate Algebra).
- 4: Upper-level (30000-40000) electives, 9 hours. Upper or lower-level electives 2. Consult with advisor. Select to ensure completion of 40 upper-level hours required for graduation.
5. Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FINN 15201 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of "C" or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FINN 15201.
