CCCUA MATH 11003 College Algebra, UNIV 10261 Transfer Seminar and UNIV 10152 Success Strategies will count for 6 hours, UAFS FINN 15201 will count for one hour.			
4. Required Business Computing Competency may be fulfilled by successful completion of CPSI 10003 Microcomputer Applications from CCCUA.			
5. Lower-level Business Core, 24 hours (includes ECON 22003). Review College of Business and Industry admission requirements for standards of performance.			

6. Concentration Requirements, 24 hours. Choose two, 12-hour concentrations to complete program on UAFS campus. Online completion option is available and requires 24 hours of UL business courses.
7. Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FINN 15201 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FINN 15201.
