Cossatot Community College of the University of Arkansas (CCCUA) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education degree from the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the bachelor's degree requirements at CCCUA by completing an Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT) from CCCUA. Completed CCCUA courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education degree requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. Per the partnership agreement, UAFS will transfer up to 56 hours of lower division coursework for the Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education.

The School of Education (SOE) at UAFS requires twelve hours of math courses beyond College Algebra prior to admission into the Elementary Education program. Students who transfer to UAFS with the earned AAT and who successfully complete the Elementary Mathematics Subtest (details found here https://ets.org/praxis/ar/requirements/) will not be required to take the additional math courses in order to be admitted into the program. Students must still complete 120 hours in order to graduate with the BS in Elementary Education.			
4. Must be admitted to the School of Education Educator Preparation Program.			
Note: Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FINN 15201 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FINN 15201.
