- 3. Upper-Level Criminal Justice electives, 21 hours. Confer with advisor.
- 4. Electives, 14 hours. Must complete at least 10 hours of upper-level hours. Consult with advisor. Select three hours of upper-level humanities, three hours of upper-level history/government, and four hours upper-level electives. The remaining four hours may come from EACC courses as noted above.
- 5. Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of "C" or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.

Program requirements-Must earn at least a "C" grade in all Criminal Justice courses applied to the degree.
