East Arkansas Community College (UA-EACC) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) majoring in Business Administration from the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the bachelor's degree requirements at UA-EACC by completing an Associate of Science in Business from UA-EACC. Completed UA-EACC courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the BBA requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. UAFS will offer the remaining requirements through the BBA - Online Completion Degree Option. Students interested in concentrations in Accounting, Finance, International Business, and Marketing will need to complete upper-level major requirements on the UAFS campus.

6. Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FINN 15201 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FINN 15201.

Student Degree Program Requirements

If students are not enrolled for two or more consecutive terms (excluding summer terms), they must re-enter under the program requirements of the current catalog.
