Eastern Oklahoma State College (EOSC) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice (BSCJ) degree from the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the bachelor degree requirements at EOSC by completing an Associate of Science in Criminal Justice. Completed EOSC courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the BSCJ degree requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. UAFS will offer the remaining BSCJ degree requirements through online courses. Per the partnership agreement, UAFS will accept up to 75 hours of lower division coursework towards the BSCJ.

Student Degree Program Requirements

A student's degree program requirements are those specified in the catalog in effect at the time of declaration of program major. Students must meet the above program requirements and the graduation requirements as indicated by institutional and college policy. The program can be changed only with the approval of the official advisor. If original courses are eliminated, students may be required to meet new curriculum requirements in the degree program.
