Northwest Arkansas Community College (NWACC) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) majoring in Business Administration from the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the bachelor’s degree requirements at NWACC by completing an Associate of Science in Business - General Transfer, from NWACC. Completed NWACC courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the BBA requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. UAFS will offer the remaining requirements through the BBA - Online Completion Degree Option. On-campus degree completion options are also available for students in a variety of areas including Accounting, Economics, Finance, Management, and Marketing.

2. These courses are used to determine major GPA, see Graduation Requirements section of the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. Students may complete MGMT 1003 Introduction to Business at NWACC to transfer into UAFS and it will count at MGMT 1203.			
3. Electives, 12 hours: MATH 1403 is eligible to be used as a general elective if needed as a prerequisite for STAT 2503. Consult with advisor for other electives.			
4. Major Electives, 24 hours. Must be upper-level course with the College of Business and at least three business disciplines must be represented (ACCT, COBI, FIN, LAW, MGMT, or MKTG). Consult with advisor.			
5. Required Business Computing Competency may be fulfilled by successful completion of ITA 1003 Introduction to Computer Information Systems or equivalent transfer course.			
6. Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.			
7. NWACC Directed Electives, 6 hours. Select one social science course and OSIM 1103 to satisfy these requirements
