3: Requirements for admission in Educator Preparation Program (EPP). Consult with faculty advisor regarding School of Education admission requirements and for courses taken after admission to program. The School of Education (SOE) at UAFS requires twelve hours of math courses beyond College Algebra prior to admission into the Elementary Education program. Students who transfer to UAFS with the earned AAT and who successfully complete the Elementary Mathematics Subtest (details found here ets.org/praxis/ar) will not be required to take the additional math courses in order to be admitted into the program. Students must still complete 120 hours in order to graduate with the BS in Elementary Education.			
4. Must be admitted to the School of Education Educator Preparation Program.			
Note: Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.
