**Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene
University of Arkansas - Fort Smith
In Partnership with Northwest Arkansas Community College**

Northwest Arkansas Community College (NWACC) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene (BSDH) degree from the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the bachelor degree requirements at NWACC by completing an Associate of Arts, Associate of Science in Liberal Arts, or an Associate of Science-Agriculture, Food, and Life Science degrees in programs approved by NWACC. Completed NWACC courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the BSDH degree requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. The remaining BSDH program requirements must be completed on the UAFS campus. Students must apply and be admitted into the Dental Hygiene Program. Selection is competitive based on courses, GPA, and interviews. Per the partnership agreement, UAFS will transfer 61 hours of lower division coursework for the BSDH.

Mathematics stipulation-must take MATH 1203 College Algebra [*MATH 1403*] and BUTR 1033 Data Analysis and Interpretation [*STAT 2503*]; for social sciences-must take PSY 2003 General Psychology [*PSYC 1163*] and SOC 2013 General Sociology [*SOCI 2753*].
 - 2: These courses are used to determine major GPA, see Graduation Requirements section of the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. Enrollment in courses beginning with DHYG prefix requires admission to the dental hygiene program.
 - 3: ITA requirement- CISQ 1103 Introduction to Computer Information Systems or ITA courses from UAFS.
 - 4: These courses must be completed prior to entrance into the dental hygiene program.
 - 5: Science courses taken more than five years prior to program application may not be eligible. See advisor for more information and to request a science course evaluation.
- Admission to the program is highly selective. A grade of "C" or better is required in all courses applicable to this program.
- Prior to graduation, students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of "C" or better, or by score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.
