University of Arkansas - Pulaski Technical College (UA - PTC) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership (BSOL) degree from the University of Arkansas - Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the bachelor degree requirements at UA - PTC by completing an Associate of Applied Science in Surgical Technology at UA - PTC. Completed UA - PTC courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the BSOL degree requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. UAFS will offer the remaining BSOL degree requirements through online courses. The transfer of general education courses required for the BSOL will be in accordance with the Arkansas Course Transfer System (ACTS) and the UAFS 75-semester-hour transfer policy related to lower division coursework for the BSOL.
