University of Arkansas Community College at Batesville (UACCB) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice (BSCJ) degree from the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the bachelor's degree requirements at UACCB by completing the Associate of Science in Criminal Justice. Completed UACCB courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the BSCJ degree requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. UAFS will offer the remaining BSCJ requirements through online courses. Per the partnership agreement, UAFS will transfer 64 hours of lower division coursework for the BSCJ.
