3: Requirements for admission in Educator Preparation Program (EPP). Consult with faculty advisor regarding School of Education admission requirements and for courses taken after admission to program. The School of Education (SOE) at UAFS requires eight hours of math courses beyond College Algebra prior to admission into the Elementary Education program.			
4. Must be admitted to the School of Education Educator Preparation Program.			
5. Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FINN 15201 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FINN 15201. COL 1001 will satisfy this requirement.			
6. Students will select either the licensure or non-licensure track. Licensure track requires CIED 49006 Residency I, CIED 48003 Seminar in K-6 Education and CIED 49010 Residency II; Non-licensure track requires 19 hours of upper or lower-level free electives.			
Students must earn a C or higher in all courses on the degree plan. Students must maintain a 2.70 cumulative GPA or better. GPA is tracked throughout the program and verified for admission into internship.

If students are not enrolled for two or more consecutive terms (excluding summer terms), they must reenter under the program requirements of the current catalog.
