Students who transfer to UAFS with the earned AAT and who successfully complete the Elementary Mathematics Subtest (details found here https://www.ets.org/praxis/ar/requirements/) will not be required to take the additional math courses in order to be admitted into the program. Students must still complete 120 hours in order to graduate with the BS in Elementary Education.

Note: Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521. COL 1001 will satisfy this requirement.
