As we near the end of this extraordinary, and yes, unprecedented, year, we find ourselves contemplating the incredible support this institution has been able to provide its students thanks to you. Through a litany of circumstances we could never have anticipated, we have been able to help students stay on track. You enabled nearly 6,000 students to progress toward their dreams because you believe in the transformative value of education. And because of your support, not only did we meet the pressing needs of our students, but we've been able to innovate our offerings as well.



Our faculty have worked tirelessly to continue offering education that positions our students to graduate at the top of their fields. Many faculty invested long hours this summer and fall, cultivating advanced skills in online teaching through the internationally acclaimed Quality Matters program. Throughout the fall semester, they offered courses in all modalities, provided research opportunities across disciplines, used cutting edge equipment to enable advanced biological and pharmacological research, and earned recognition and praise from agencies across the country, all to help their students reach their loftiest goals.



As our faculty build up our academic excellence, our need to recruit broader pools of students and tell the stories of our institution has intensified. So we have invested in Slate technology to help us better communicate with our prospective students and a major marketing initiative that will spread the message of all UAFS has to offer far and wide.

Last month we celebrated the grand opening of our UAFS Writing Center, built thanks to a \$2.25 million grant from the Department of Education. This center will further empower students to become confident, complete writers, connecting faculty, staff, and tutors with students who wish to improve their writing, editing, and research.

And as we head into the holidays, we must recognize the rapid expansion of the Dave Stevens Lion Pride Pantry. More than 100 families will pick up Thanksgiving meal kits from the pantry this week, with turkey and all the trimming, and hundreds more will be supplied with shelf-stable food to last through winter break. In just one year, the pantry has evolved from a stand-alone blessing box to a fully stocked food and needs pantry with deep freezers and produce carts so our students and their families can thrive.




# Endowment Update

## Fiscal Year Ending




The past fiscal year has been among the most challenging periods in U.S. history. The year started on a bright note with the U.S. economy and stock market producing positive returns only to come to a sudden halt with the spread of COVID-19 and a global pandemic. UAFS Foundation's investment portfolio returned 2.7% during fiscal year 2020. It was led by the capital preservation segment (fixed income-oriented) which returned 4.5% while the capital appreciation segment (equity-oriented) returned 1.4%. The investment portfolio is well-diversified across multiple asset classes and is designed to weather the current environment of higher asset valuations and macro uncertainties.






## **UAFS Endowment Totals**
