All Spanish with teacher licensure majors are required to pass the Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) at the Advanced-Low level prior to their internship semester. In addition, all Spanish with Teacher Licensure majors are required to pass a capstone project (SPAN 4993) with a grade of "C" or better prior to graduation.

Students must earn a C or higher in all courses on the degree plan. Students must maintain a $\mathbf{2 . 7 5}$ cumulative GPA or better. GPA is tracked throughout the program and verified for admission into internship.

Students who pass both the WPT and OPIc with an awarded score of Advanced-Low or higher may be able to earn credit towards their degree. Please see your advisor for more information.
