- Social studies and History requirements, 24 hours. Social studies: POLS 2853 and GEOG 2753 are required and select six upper-level hours from two different disciplines in GEOG, POLS, PSYC, or SOCI with advisor approval. Select six hours from United States history, 3400 or 4100 series courses, or HIST 4903. Select three hours from global history in 3000, 3100, 3200, 3300, 3500, 3600, 4200, 4300 series courses, or HIST 4903. Select three hours from the following: HIST 3053, 3063, 3103, 3203, 3213, or 4903.
- 4. Requirements for Admission in Educator Preparation Program (EPP). These must be completed with required grades for admission to the program. Consult with faculty advisor regarding School of Education admission requirements and for courses taken after admission to program.
- 5. Must be admitted to the School of Education, Educator Preparation Program.

The department requires all history courses and POLS 2753 & POLS 2853 counted toward fulfillment of the degree requirements to be passed with a grade of B or better.

Students must earn a C or higher in all courses on the degree plan. Students must maintain a 2.75 cumulative GPA or better. GPA is tracked throughout the program and verified for admission into the internship.

Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.

Student Degree Program Requirements

By signing below, it is understood that admission is by application to the Teacher Credential and Standards Committee (TCSC) of the Teacher Education Council (TEC). Applications are available from the School of Education. Once admitted, students must maintain satisfactory progress throughout the completion of the Educator Preparation Program according to the criteria cited above and any additional program standards in effect or lose eligibility to continue the program. A student's degree program requirements are those specified in the catalog in effect at the time of declaration of program major. If not on the Guaranteed 8-semester degree plan, students may choose to meet the program requirements specified in the catalog for a later year from when they began their program of study. Students must meet the above program requirements and the graduation requirements as indicated by institutional and college policy. The program can be changed only with the approval of the official advisor. If original courses are eliminated, students may be required to meet new curriculum requirements of the current catalog. Students are not enrolled for two or more consecutive terms (excluding summer terms), they must re-enter under the program Prusuant to Act 1014 of 2005, qualified first-time freshmen with a declared major may elect to participate in the guaranteed 8-semester degree completion Program Outpart to Act 1014 of 2005, qualified in the advisor before the first day of classes for the student's first term of attendance.
